Seminar Announcement

OSA is organizing a seminar on “Decolonizing Research and Knowledge Production” for early career researchers on June 13, 2023. The seminar unpacks the hegemonic discourses and methodological approaches in research and knowledge production that silence alternative voices. Through an interactive approach, it aims at provoking young researchers to critically revisit the ‘taken-for-granted’ forms of knowledge production, writing, and dissemination. The seminar introduces participants to conceptual lenses of intersectionality, epistemic disobedience and decoloniality, enabling them to reflect on what is considered knowledge, who owns/produces it, how, for what purpose, and with what outcomes. It will also address the challenges of publishing scholarly papers, which entails navigating through complex politics and economies of publishing and the skills of conforming to different standards.

The seminar will be offered by Professor Tatek Abebe from Norwegian University of Science and Technology (NTNU). Tatek Abebe’s current research focuses on youth activism, the politics of development and future-making, and questions of epistemic justice. His latest publications include coedited volumes on Southern Theories and Decolonial Childhood Studies, and The Routledge Handbook of Childhood and Global Development.
